Share the Spirit....

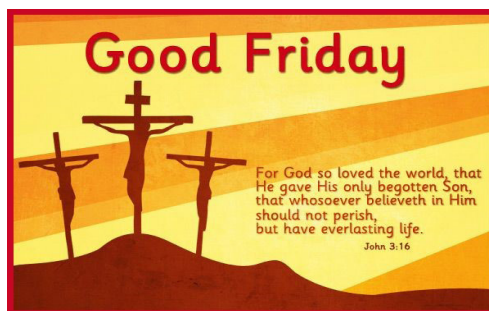
Dear Parents and Carers,

We are now in the final week of preparations for Easter – Holy Week.



Jesus spends this night with his friends. Before the meal he demonstrates to his Apostles what leadership should look like – to lead you must serve. Jesus got on his hands and knees and washed the filthy, dusty feet of his followers. Then Jesus took bread and wine, blessed it and shared it with his friends saying 'This is my body, this is my blood do this in memory of me'. More than 2000 years later we still do this in memory of Jesus every time we are at Mass. Jesus then goes to the Mount of Olives to pray. He takes friends with him but they are too tired to stay awake at the very time that Jesus really needed them. Jesus is arrested and lead away.

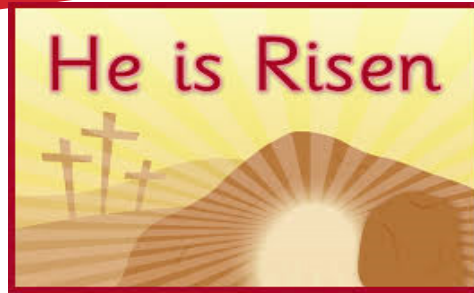
